In preparation to kick off our testing season at the Nursery, we had about 20 energetic members bring helping hands and their equipment to our annual cleanup day. The willow that fell late winter at the end of Pond 7 met with a chainsaw, and then provided fuel for the burn pile. In addition, quite a bit of brush was cleared and hauled to different piles either for burning or chipping. The ponds were treated to control algae and unwanted vegetation growth. Marilyn Richards and Vonnie Peterson worked the grill and cooked us burgers and brats. After lunch, and a Twinkie, Joe Weimer set up a nice series in the master field for our afternoon of training. Big thanks to Joe Ricuprio and Shannon Black for the all the preparation work on the property and organizing the entire day.

The grounds are now ready for a first cut mowing, which should be completed by the time you receive this letter. The brush around the ponds will be cut back shortly after mowing is complete.

This year, recognizing we regularly have quite a number of people gathered at the Nursery for tests, we upgraded our first aid kit by adding a Phisio-Control Lifepak Express AED. The device is similar to the type found in public areas such as schools or airports, and designed to be simple to use. During events, it will be stored in the equipment trailer.
